Day 1: Muscat-Salalah

Transfer to Muscat Airport for a flight to Salalah (airfare not included). On arrival transfer to the hotel. Overnight in Salalah.

Day 2: Salalah

After breakfast, visit the West side of Salalah and pass by the site of the famous Frankincense trees. Drive to splendid Mughsail Bay, where the mountains rise straight up from the beach and see the blowholes. Journey to the Prophet Job's tomb, perched

high up in the jebels overlooking the city of Salalah. Drive back to your hotel. In the afternoon, enjoy a sightseeing tour of Salalah passing Al-Balid archaeological dig and drive through the scenic Corniche that leads to old Salalah. Continue to gold souk, Haffa Souk and to Dhofar museum. Overnight in Salalah. (B) **Day 3: Salalah**

Day 3: Salalah

After breakfast, depart to explore East Salalah, pass by the Royal Farm and the Mamura Palace to Ayn Raza, a beautiful area surrounded by green hills. Drive through Qara Mountains to the ruins of Sumhuram at Khowr Rawri. This was a site of the Queen of Sheba's legendary palace. Continue to Mirbat, one of Salalah's best-known historic sites, Bin Ali's Mosque and Taqa villages. Afternoon at your own leisure. Overnight in Salalah. (B)

Day 4: Salalah-Muscat

After breakfast transfer to Salalah Airport for flight to Muscat (airfare not included). Transfer to your hotel. (B)

3 Days

Oman Essentials

Departs: Daily

Day 1: Muscat-Ras Al Hadd

This morning depart by 4WD for an adventure trip of a lifetime. First stop will be Wadi Dayqah, a beautiful man-made dam. Then proceed to Wadi Arbaeen, one of the most beautiful wadis in Muscat region. Proceed to the lush green Wadi Shad. From here continue to Wadi Tiwi, a city lost under the palms. Drive to Sur, a seafaring town. Continue on the coastal road until Ras Al Hadd for our overnight stay. At night, visit Ras Al Junayz, the unique turtle reserve where



turtles lay their eggs. Overnight Ras Al Hadd Beach Hotel or similar. (D) Day 2: Ras Al Hadd-Wahiba Sands

Travel to Jalan Bani Bu Ali on the South Eastern coast, which dates back to the third century. Visit the unique 52 domed Jamee Al Hamoda Mosque built in eleventh century. Continue to the nearby ruins of Al Hamoda fort, dating back 300 years. Proceed to Wadi Bani Khalid, a lush green valley surrounded by rugged mountains. After lunch drive up to Al Wasil, for overnight camping. Arrive at the campsite then experience a thrilling 4x4 dune drive. Enjoy a traditional BBQ dinner. Overnight in a traditional camp at Wahiba Sands. (B, D)

Day 3: Wahiba Sands-Muscat

After breakfast, depart by four-wheel-drive to the town of Mudairib, a pretty village dominated by its rectangular fort. Continue to Muscat and upon arrival drop off at your hotel. (B)

Day 1: Muscat

Upon arrival into Muscat, transfer to your hotel for overnight.

Day 2: Muscat

Enjoy a city tour of Muscat, the capital city of Oman. It is known to be one of the most attractive cities in the Gulf region. This morning we will visit the Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, that has a remarkable architectural achievement. Wander the Corniche and visit the fish souk and Muttrah souk (Arabian market place). Visit Bait Al Zubair museum, the



museum has Oman's finest and most comprehensive collections of antiques from all over the Sultanate. Alternatively the Bait Branda museum exhibits Omani heritage. Take a walk through the old city flanked by twin 16th century forts "Jalali" and "Mirani". (B, L)

Day 3: Muscat-Wadi Bani Khalid-Wahiba Sands-Nizwa

Depart by four-wheel drive to Wadi Bani Khalid, the evergreen wadi - Amidst stark rocky outcrops of mountains, a lush valley oasis is born on rich earth provided with plentiful water. Then continue to Wahiba Sands, enjoy a roller-coaster ride over the dunes and then proceed to Nizwa, which was once the capital of Oman. Overnight in Nizwa. (B, L)

Day 4: Nizwa-Jebal Shams

This morning we visit the 17th century round tower fort and the bustling souk. Proceed to visit the magnificent castle of Jibreen and continue to the ancient fort of Bahla (fort closed for renovation). Drive to Al Hamra village to see the remaining of old style mud brick houses, visit "Bait Al Safa", one of oldest house of Seikh which has been transformed into a lively museum. Photo stop at Wadi Ghul. The Wadi stands out against the brown mountains and the village nestles at the foot of the hills. Continue to Jebal Shams – also known as "the mountain of the Sun" for overnight. (B, L, D)

Day 5: Jebal Shams-Wadi Bani Awf-Muscat

After breakfast, drive down the mountain, cross the Hajar mountains onward to Nakhl. Bilad Sayt, a scenic oasis settlement, can be seen at the bottom of the gorge. Enter the outskirts of the village of Wadi Bani Awf, and catch a glimpse of ancient cliff side houses. Continue driving to the ancient fort of Nakhl. After a look around the fort, visit Nakhl Hot Springs then proceed to

Muscat. (B, L) Day 6: Muscat

After breakfast transfer to Muscat Airport for departure. (B)



Day 3: Muscat-Wadi Bani Khalid-Wahiba Sands-Nizwa

Depart by 4WD to Wadi Bani Khalid, the evergreen wadi. The blue pools are perfect for a refreshing dip. Continue to Wahiba Sands, described a sand sea, running south from the Eastern Hajjar Mountains to Arabian Sea. After the tour we proceed to Nizwa, once the capital of Oman. Overnight in Nizwa. (B, L)

Day 4: Nizwa-Muscat

After breakfast, visit the round tower fort and the bustling souk. Proceed to the castle of Jibreen then the ancient fort of Bahla (fort closed for renovation), famous for its pottery and included in UNESCO's list of World Heritage Sites. Drive to Al Hamra village to see the remains of old style mud brick houses. Also visit one of oldest houses of Seikh "Bait Al Safa". Overnight in Muscat. (B, L)

Day 5: Muscat

After breakfast transfer to Muscat Airport for departure. (B)

Day 1: Muscat

Upon arrival into Muscat, transfer to your hotel for overnight. Muscat is Oman's port capital which sits on the Gulf of Oman surrounded by mountains and desert.

Day 2: Muscat

Enjoy a city tour of Muscat-undoubtedly one of the most attractive cities in the Gulf region. Visit the largest mosque in Oman, the Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, a remarkable architectural achievement. Modern, marble-clad

Sultan Qaboos Grand Mosque, with 50m dome and prodigious Persian carpet, can accommodate 20,000 people. Wander the Corniche and visit the fish souk, Muttrah souk and Bait Al Zubair museum which has the most finest and comprehensive collections of antiques from all over the Sultanate. Take a walk through the old city of Muscat flanked by twin sixteenth century forts "Jalali" and "Mirani". Return to your hotel for overnight. (B, L)

Day 3: Muscat-Wadi Shab-Sur-Ras Al Hadd

Drive through one of the most thrilling sections of Oman's 1,700 kilometre coastline. First visit the famous Sinkhole, a part of a collapsed mountain filled with sea water. Proceed to Wadi Shab, known for its lush green wadis with waters flowing most of the year and continue to Wadi TIWI, a luxuriant valley. Continue by driving to the port city of Sur which is famous for building wooden ships. Its shipyards, which still produce traditional wooden vessels, played a pivotal role in Oman's maritime past. In the city centre, Sunaysilah Fort has 4 defensive towers around a courtyard and boasts a commanding view over Sur. After a quick tour of Sur, continue to Ras Al Hadd and at night visit the unique turtle reserve with possibility of watching turtles laying eggs at night. Turtles spend most of their lives at sea, but



adult female turtles spend a short time on land each year laying their eggs. They always choose quiet sandy beaches for their nesting. The beach is distinguished by its spectacular bays and rock formations which are havens for large numbers of birds. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Ras Al Hadd-Wadi Bani Khalid-Wahiba Sands

Visit Wadi Bani Khalid, a lush green valley surrounded by rugged mountains. Continue to Wahiba Sands - home to a few thousand Bedouins. Wahiba Sands is renowned for its unique desert ecosystem and surprisingly rich biodiversity. Opportunity for dune bashing. Dinner and overnight Wahiba Sands during winter. During summer May-Sep overnight in Ibra due to closure of camp site. (B, L, D) **Day 5: Wahiba Sands-Nizwa**

Depart to Mudairib, a pretty village dominated by its rectangular fort. Travel to lbra, then continue to Birkat Al Mauz, enjoy a walk through its oasis and dense date plantations and visit the Falaj. Proceed to Nizwa, which was once the capital of Oman. Nizwa is renowned for its silver jewellery which is considered to be the best in the country. Its people are masters in making khanjars (curved daggers), recognised for their distinctive style and patterns. They also make copper ware, coffee pots, swords, leather goods and pottery. (B, L)

Day 6: Nizwa-Muscat

Visit the 17th century round tower fort and the bustling souk known for its silver and copper handicrafts. Then visit the magnificent castle of Jibreen, continue to the ancient fort of Bahla. Bahla is now included in UNESCO's list of world heritage sites. See the remaining old style brick mud brick houses at Al Hamra village. Visit one of the oldest house of Seikh "Bait Al Safa", Overnight Muscat. (B, L)

Day 7: Muscat

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for departure. (B)

Continue to reach Ras Al Hadd and at night visit the unique Turtle reserve. (B, L, D)

Day 4: Ras Al Hadd-Nizwa

Depart to Wadi Bani Khalid - a lush green valley and famous for its natural beauty. Continue to Wahiba Sands, one of the most fascinating and mysterious regions of Oman. The Wahiba is also home to a few thousand Bedouins. Experience a thrilling ride of dune bashing with our experienced drivers. Then continue to Nizwa via Sinaw. Overnight in Nizwa. (B, L)

Day 5: Nizwa-Muscat

This morning we visit the 17th century round tower fort and the bustling souk known for its silver and copper handicrafts. Proceed to the magnificent castle of Jibreen and then to the ancient fort of Bahla (fort closed for renovation). Historic town of Bahla is famous for its pottery and a has become UNESCO World Heritage site. Drive to AI Hamra village, visit "Bait AI Safa - a traditional Omani house where you will see how Omanis used to live. Visit the mountain village of Misfah before returning to Muscat. (B, L)

Depart to Mudairib, a pretty village dominated by its fort. Then to Ibra, which was once a centre of trade, religion, education and art. Continue to Birkat Al Mauz to enjoy its oasis. Also visit the Falaj then proceed to Nizwa. (B, L)

Day 6: Nizwa-Jebal Shams

Visit the 17th century round tower fort and the bustling souk known for its silver and copper handicrafts. Then proceed to the magnificent castle of Jibreen and the ancient fort of Bahla. Drive to the date palm groves at Al Hamra village to see the remains of old style mud brick houses. Continue for overnight at Jebal Shams, one of the highest peaks in the region also known as 'the Mountain of the Sun'. (B, L, D) Day 7: Jebal Shams-Wadi Bani Awf-Muscat

Drive down crossing the Hajjar mountains

onward to Nakhl. Bilad Sayt, a scenic oasis settlement, can be seen at the bottom of the gorge that plunges just beyond the rocky summit. Continue to the ancient fort of Nakhl, built in the pre-Islamic era. Visit Nakhl Hot Springs then proceed to Muscat for overnight. (B, L)







Oman General Information



Introduction

The country of Oman is something of an enigma. It borders the United Arab Emirates, Saudi Arabia and Yemen. Oman has something for everyone, World Heritage listed ancient archaeological sites, deserts, beaches, islands, mountains, caves and springs, Oman proves it is a country full of contrasts

Time Zone

Oman is four hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time, which means the country is approximately seven hours behind during AEST in summer and six hours behind during winter.

Currency

The Omani Rial is the official currency of Oman. Each Rial is made up of 1000 Baiza. In most tourist areas, banks and moneychangers are available to exchange money. There are also ATM's around the country.

Tipping

As a general rule, 10% of a bill in any restaurant is recommended. With regards to tipping guides and drivers, we suggest putting aside US\$2 per person per day.

Climate

The climate between November and March is widely considered to be the best time to travel due to the cooler temperatures averaging 25°C. Throughout the rest of the year, Oman can be extremely hot, particularly between May and August. However between mid-June to late-August, the rainy season in the Southern region of Dhofar and Salalah comes alive with grassy green hills and a comfortable drizzle of rain. Generally winter is cool and pleasant while summer can be very hot and humid.

Official Language

Arabic is the official Language of Oman however English and some Asian languages are also widely spoken throughout tourist areas.

Electricity

240 volts, 50 hertz. A European or British adapter would be required.

Visas

Australians can now apply for their Oman visas online before they travel, a convenient alternative to visa-on-arrival. Australian passport holders can apply online through the Royal Oman Police website before they travel: www.evisa.rop.gov.om Applicants must register as a user prior to completing the step-by-step process which is in plain English. The different visa types are described along with pricing and permitted lengths of stay. To complete your online application you will need a scanned copy of the photo page of your passport, as well as a digital (jpeg) passport photo. Passengers eligible for a visa on arrival at Muscat International Airport can make their visa payments at the Travelex Foreign Exchange counter located in the immigration arrivals hall. Payments are accepted in most currencies or by credit card. On payment, an automatic receipt will be issued to the traveller. This receipt is then presented at the immigration desk for the visa. A 30 day tourist visa fee is 20 Omani Rials - approximately AU\$71.00 (subject to exchange rate on the day)

Getting There

By Air: Getting to Oman is relatively easy as there are many airlines flying including Emirates, Etihad, British Airways, Lufthansa, Royal Jordanian and Qatar Airways. There are daily flights between the airlines with links via Asia, UAE and Europe. By Sea: While there is a port at Muscat
