



Zagreb to Venice

Departs: Mondays

Day 1 Mon: Zagreb

Welcome to Zagreb! Be met at the airport and transferred to the hotel. Then the day is at leisure to get settled in or begin exploring. Later, gather for a Welcome Dinner with your traveling companions. Overnight in Zagreb at hotel Westin or Sheraton or similar. (D)

Day 8 Mon: Split-Trogir-Plitvice Lakes

Day 9 Tue: Plitvice Lakes

A full day to enjoy spectacular Plitvice Lakes National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Have your camera ready as you take a walking tour around several of the lower lakes. Enjoy the breathtaking scenery of this natural wonder with 16 terraced lakes surrounded by thickly wooded mountains and lush vegetation. Overnight in Plitvice Lakes at hotel Jezero or similar. Departs: Fridays

Day 1 Fri: Moscow

Upon arrival in Moscow, meet and be transferred to your hotel. The rest of the day is free to relax or perhaps begin independent discovery of the fabled capital of Russia. Tonight, enjoy a welcome reception hosted by the tour director to introduce fellow travellers. Overnight in the Sheraton hotel or similar. (D)

Day 2 Sat: Moscow

After the store visit, travel by motor coach along the Moskva River, passing the baroque Novodevichy Convent and ending the tour at the popular Arbat shopping district. The rest of the say is at leisure. In the evening, enjoy a cruise on the Moskva River for the most picturesque sights of Moscow. Overnight in Moscow. (B)

Day 3 Sun: Moscow-Sergiev Posad-Moscow

Today, travel 75km North of Moscow to the small town of Sergiev Posad, founded in the 14th century. It is renowned as a center of ancient Russian art and architecture. For centuries, it served as a place of pilgrimage and as a religious capital of Russia. Within the old walled city, the fairytale golden and blue domes of the Holy Trinity St. Sergius Lavra beckon. This monastery is quite possible the most beautiful of all. After lunch at a popular restaurant, return to Moscow. The rest of the day is at leisure. In the evening, join an optional Moscow by night and Subway tour. Overnight in Moscow. (B, L)

Day 4 Mon: Moscow-St. Petersburg

Today, enjoy time at leisure in Moscow before boarding the Sapsan train for a four hour, high-speed ride to St. Petersburg.
