

Departs: Selected Thursdays

Day 1 Thu: Istanbul

Arrive in Istanbul and transfer to your hotel. Welcome briefing in the evening. Overnight Conrad (Deluxe) or Movenpick Istanbul Hotel (FC).

Day 2 Fri: Istanbul-Sightseeing

Full day tour of Istanbul which includes Hagia Sophia Church (Museum). This masterpiece of Byzantine architecture is one of the most extraordinary buildings in the history of architecture. Also visit Topkapi Palace, Blue Mosque, Grand Bazaar and Hippodrome where chariot races and competitive athletic events took place during the Roman period. Optional dinner with belly dancing and entertainment. Overnight Istanbul. (B)

Day 3 Sat: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Canakkale

In the morning, drive to Tekirdağ city and visit Barbare Vineyard. Learn about wine making, tour the vineyard and indulge in fine wines. Then depart for Gallipoli, the site of many battles during WWI. Visit Anzac Cove, Lone Pine Cemetery and Chunuk Bair, then overnight near Gallipoli. Caeli Hotel (Deluxe) or Kolin Hotel (FC). (B)

Day 4 Sun: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Izmir

Visit Troy founded by Ilus the son of Tros in 3000 BC. Today at the site there stands a symbolic wooden horse that was built to commemorate the legendary war. Continue the tour by driving to Pergamum, the rival city of Ephesus and the capital of the rich Pergamum Kingdom before the Roman Empire. Today lunch will be held in a local village in Pergamum, village people will greet guests and lunch will be held in their houses. After lunch guests will be able to walk around the village and see the true village life in Turkey. After lunch visit Asclepion Ancient Medical Center. Continue to Izmir for overnight at Swiss Grand Ephesus (Deluxe) or Kaya Thermal (FC). (B, L)

Day 5 Mon: Izmir-Ephesus & St Mary's House-Izmir

Tour the famous ruins of Ephesus one of the best-preserved ancient cities in the world. During the Roman era Ephesus was an extremely wealthy city, known worldwide as a city of trade, art, entertainment and finance. Then visit St Mary's cottage, it is said that the Virgin Mary spent her last years here and that St. John the Evangelist came here to look after her. Continue to a regional rug production center to have a firsthand experience of this unique art form. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (B, D)

Day 6 Tue: Izmir-Bodrum

Morning departure for Bodrum. Start an explorative tour of the wonderful city of Bodrum on foot. Visit Castle of Saint Peter and the renowned Underwater Museum. Dinner and overnight at The Marmara Hotel (deluxe) or Ramada Resort (FC). (B)

Day 7 Wed: Bodrum

Day at leisure. There is the choice of an optional day tour to Greek island of Kos, known for its abundant sandy beaches. Kos is rich with Greek and Roman landmarks. Overnight in Bodrum. (B)

Day 8 Thu: Bodrum-Pamukkale

Drive through fertile valleys to Pamukkale. Meaning 'cotton castle', it is a natural site of limestone that cascades down the mountain. The ancient city of Hierapolis was built on top of the white 'castle', and you can still see the ruins of the city. Visit ruins of Roman health spa of Hierapolis and enjoy a swim in your hotel's thermal pool. Overnight at Doga Thermal Health and Spa (Deluxe) or Adempira Hotel (FC). (B, D)

Day 9 Fri: Pamukkale-Antalya

After breakfast, depart for Antalya, a resort city and gateway to Turkey's southern Mediterranean region, known as the Turquoise Coast for its blue waters. Remnants remain from Antalya's time as a major Roman port, including Hadrian's Gate, built to honour the Roman emperor's visit in 130 AD and the 2nd century Hidirlik Tower, with its beautiful views of Antalya Bay. Dinner and overnight at Akra Antalya (Deluxe) or Double Tree (FC). (B, D)

Day 10 Sat: Perge-Aspendos-Antalya

This morning visit Perge and Aspendos. Rest of the afternoon at leisure to explore Antalya Roman past. Overnight In Antalya. (B, D)

Day 11 Sun: Antalya-Cappadocia

Early morning departure for Cappadocia. On the way visit 13th century Caravansaray and later visit underground city of Saratli. Dinner and overnight at unique Cave Style hotel Gamirasu (Deluxe), Utopia (FC). (B, D)

Day 12 Mon: Cappadocia

This morning there is the option for an early morning balloon tour over Cappadocia. Experience floating over the volcanic valleys and fairy chimneys as the sun rises over this unique landscape. After breakfast visit Avanos, Pasabagi, Red Valley and Goreme, the open air museum which is a monastic complex of rock churches and chapels covered with frescoes. Brief stop at a regional pottery workshop. Dinner at a special local restaurant to try traditional delicatessen. Optional Whirling dervishes performance. Overnight in Cappadocia. (B, D)

Day 13 Tue: Cappadocia-Ankara

This morning, depart early for Turkey's capital city of Ankara. Enjoy an afternoon tour of the Ataturk Mausoleum and the Museum of Anatolian Civilizations, that houses the most extensive and valuable collection of Hittite artifacts in the world, including those from the Old Hittite Kingdom, the Assyrian Trade Colonies, the Late Hittite kingdoms, the Phrygian and Urartian cultures. Enjoy dinner at a special local restaurant. Overnight in Ankara at the Ankara Sheraton Hotel (Deluxe) or Divan Ankara. (FC). (B, D)

Day 14 Wed: Ankara-Istanbul

After breakfast drive to Istanbul. Optional afternoon tour including a cruise on the Bosphorus with a visit to the exotic Spice Market. Tonight enjoy a farewell dinner with the rest of your tour group. Overnight in Istanbul at Conrad (Deluxe) or Movenpick Bosphorus (FC). (B, D)

Day 15 Thu: Istanbul

After breakfast transfer to Istanbul Airport. (B)

Jewels of Turkey

Departs: Saturdays

Note: This tour can also start on Sundays with 1 night accommodation & sightseeing in Istanbul at the end instead of the beginning of the tour.

Day 1 Sat: Istanbul

Upon arrival you will be met by our representative and transferred to your Hotel. Rest of day at your own leisure.

Overnight at Double Tree By Hilton Piyalepasa or similar.

Day 2 Sun: Istanbul

Full day guides tour of most fascinating sites of Istanbul. First stop is Topkapi

Palace, a setting for state occasions and royal entertainments of the Ottoman Sultans, then visit the famous Hagia Sophia as well the Sultan Ahmet Mosque. Known to many as the Blue Mosque, this practicing mosque gains its nickname from the thousands of blue tiles which adorn the interior. Afternoon visit to Spice Bazaar. Overnight at Doubletree by Hilton Piyalepasa. (B)

Day 3 Mon: Istanbul-Gallipoli-Canakkale

Morning drive south to the Gallipoli peninsula with the Aegean Sea to the west and the Dardanelles straits to the east. Visit Anzac Cove, Nek, Chunuk Bair, and Lone Pine before crossing the Dardanelles by car ferry to Canakkale. Dinner and overnight at Kolin Hotel. (B, D)

Day 4 Tue: Canakkale-Troy-Pergamum-Kusadasi

This morning continue south to the legendary site of Troy, now known to all as the location where the Trojan War took place. Walk the same streets where the Hero Hector once strode. After crossing Mount Ida arrive to Pergamum. Explore this ancient city perched atop a high acropolis. See the ruined temples and amphitheatre before getting back onto the coach for the drive to Kusadasi. Overnight in Kusadasi at Charisma Deluxe (SC) or Casa Del Sole (FC). (B, D)

Day 5 Wed: Kusadasi-Ephesus-Sirince-Kusadasi

After breakfast visit Turkey's most famous site: Greco-Roman city of Ephesus. See the colonnaded streets, temples, tombs and even toilets. Continue on to the marvellous village of Sirince where we will be able to do shopping and taste delicious wines. Return to Kusadasi for overnight Charisma Deluxe (SC) or Casa Del Sole (FC). (B, D)

Day 6 Thu: Kusadasi-Pamukkale

This morning drive through the lush plains and cotton farms to Pamukkale. Enjoy



some free time at the lime cascades and discover the histories behind the ancient spa retreat of Hierapolis. Perhaps experience some of the delights the ancients felt while swimming in Cleopatra's pool. Dinner and overnight in Pamukkale at Adem Pira Hotel Pamukkale (SC) or Lycus River (FC) or similar. (B, D)

Day 7 Fri: Pamukkale-Koycegiz-Fethiye

Drive to the lakeside town Koycegiz, where we take a boat cruise to Turtle Beach and enjoy some pampering at the local mudbath. Continue to Fethiye for overnight at Marina Boutique Hotel. (B, D)

Day 8 Sat: Fethiye-Kayakoy-Oludeniz-Fethiye

Visit the Greek Village of Kayakoy. Once a thriving Greek town with over 1000 houses, two churches, 14 chapels and two schools, deserted when the 25,000 Greeks were repatriated to Greece. Explore the ghost town before driving on to Oludeniz for opportunity see the famed Blue Lagoon. Enjoy swimming in the crystal clear waters or sunbathing on the golden sandy beach. (B)

Day 9 Sun: Fethiye-Antalya

Today we will drive to Antalya. Take a walk in the Old Town featuring beautiful architecture and see the Hadrian Gate. Then also visit Duden Waterfalls in Lara. Overnight Antalya. (B)

Day 10 Mon: Antalya-Aspendos-Konya-Cappadocia

After breakfast departure to Konya, stopping enroute at Aspendos and view its majestic theatre. Upon arrival in Konya, tour the monastery of the Mevlana and his Whirling Dervishes. Visit the museum and learn the history behind this unusual dance and religion. Afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljuk a fine example of an ancient Silk Road. Overnight and dinner in Cappadocia at Crown Plaza Nevsehir (SC) or Burcu Kaya hotel (FC) or similar. (B, D)

Day 11 Tue: Cappadocia

Full day touring the unique region of Cappadocia known for its landscapes and Fairy Chimneys. First stop is to the Kaymakli underground city. One of the largest underground settlements, the tunnels and rooms are still used today for storage, cellars and stables. Continue on to the Open Air Museum at Goreme, a reminder of the Christians who once used the natural landscape to hide from the raiding Muslim parties. Finish the day with a visit to the natural fortress in Uchisar. Optional Turkish Folklore evening with dinner. (B)

Day 12 Wed: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu

Optional morning balloon ride to enjoy watching the sun rise from the air over the fantastic scenery below. After breakfast at the hotel, depart for Safranbolu via the capital of Turkey. Upon arrival in Ankara, visit the Mausoleum of the founder of the Republic of Turkey, Ataturk. Visit the museum detailing specific events of

Turkey's history. Continue on to the city named after Saffron, Safranbolu, which is still produced today, nearby. Dinner and overnight at a special category traditional hotel - Imren Lokum Konagi. (B, D)

Day 13 Thu: Safranbolu-Istanbul

Today enjoy a morning tour of the interesting UNESCO World Heritage Listed village of Safranbolu. Be sure to taste some of its famed Turkish Delight before the drive back to Istanbul. Upon arrival, enjoy an afternoon visit to the Grand Bazaar. Overnight in Istanbul at The Kent hotel in old town. (B)

Day 14 Fri: Istanbul

Breakfast at the hotel and transfer at 9am or 13:00 to Istanbul Airport airport. (B)

Black Sea Extension

Day 14 Fri: Istanbul-Trabzon

After breakfast transfer to Istanbul airport for flight to Trabzon. Visit Sumela Monastery nestled into the side of rocks in a famous valley in Macka. The 1000-year-old Monastery of the Virgin Mary at Sumela is among the most impressive sights of Turkey's Black Sea coast. It's 35 to 45-minute hike uphill from the parking

lot to the monastery entrance. The land around the monastery is now preserved as Altindere National Park. Transfer to Novotel Hotel. (B, D)

Day 15 Sat: Trabzon-Istanbul

After breakfast, transfer to airport for flight back to Istanbul. Transfer to hotel. Day at leisure. (B)

Day 16 Sun: Istanbul

After breakfast transfer to the Istanbul Airport at 09:00 or 13:00. (B)

Departs: Fridays

Day 1 Fri: Istanbul

Upon your arrival, you will be met by our representative before transfer to your Hotel. Overnight Arena hotel old town.

Day 2 Sat: Istanbul Full Day tour

After breakfast at the hotel, a guided tour to Topkapi Palace, St. Sophia, Blue Mosque and the Grand Bazaar will commence. The day ends with an overnight stay in Istanbul. (B)

Day 3 Sun: Istanbul-Cappadocia

After breakfast, transfer to airport for flight to Kayseri. Upon arrival visit Turasan wine factory and enjoy tasting beautiful wines of Cappadocia. Then continue for an exciting jeep safari adventure in Cappadocia. Driving from Goreme to Cavusin through Love Valley, we'll make frequent photo stops en route. Arriving into Cavusin town walk up to the old city carved on to the rocks and see the Church of St. John the Baptist, one of the oldest cave churches in Cappadocia. Next head to Ortahisar via the Rose Valley. After visiting the picturesque Ortahisar Castle continue to Uzengi Valley, our drive takes us along the brook bank, where we'll be able to see the pigeon houses carved into the rocks. Later we arrive into Mustafapasa Village (Sinassos), a former Greek town that was inhabited by the Greeks until the population exchange in 1924. After some relaxing time in the town drive back to Goreme via Pancarlik, Pigeons and Babaccik valleys. After the tour transfer to MDC Cave Hotel or Yusuf Yigitoglu in Cappadocia. (B, D)

Day 4 Mon: Cappadocia Full Day tour

Early in the morning an optional Balloon tour is available. Then, full day excursion in Cappadocia including visits to the Kaymakli Underground City, Open Air Museum in Goreme and natural fortress in Uchisar. Lunch in a cave rest. to taste famous Pottery Kebap. Here, opportunity to discover and understand the rich history behind local handicrafts like hand-made carpets, Turkish tiles, onyx and potteries. Optional night tour with a Turkish show and dinner is available tonight. Overnight stay in Cappadocia. (B, L)

Day 5 Tue: Cappadocia-Konya-Pamukkale


Early departure for Pamukkale. On the way, visit the 13th century Seljukian masterpiece Sultanhan Caravanserai before arrival in Konya. After visiting the Mausoleum of Mevlana, we continue our drive to Pamukkale for an overnight stay at Adem Pira Hotel. (B, D)

Day 6 Wed: Pamukkale-Izmir

After breakfast, visit the ancient Hierapolis with the magnificent Necropolis, graveyard and the lime cascade. Thereafter, we continue our drive to Selcuk to visit Temple of Artemis "one of the seven wonders of the ancient world" then continue to Izmir for overnight at Kaya Prestige. (B, D)

Day 7 Thu: Izmir-Ephesus-Sirince-Izmir

Morning drive to Ancient city of Ephesus where we will visit its magnificent library, theater and temples. Lunch in nomadic tent in Selcuk to taste Turkish Gozleme. Day 1: Istanbul

In the afternoon visit the Open Air Museum in Goreme where the remains of rock-cut churches date back hundreds of years. Overnight in Dinler Hotel (Superior) or Yusuf Yigitoglu Hotel (Special). (B, L, D)

Day 4: Cappadocia

After breakfast hike through the Rose Valley with visits to the churches, both with the beautiful painted decoration. Afterwards visit the old Christian village of Cavusin. 

After lunch climb the hill to visit the House of Mother Mary where she is thought to have spent her last years together with St. John. Return to Kusadasi for overnight stay at the Efe Boutique Hotel. Enjoy a splendid dinner at a fine restaurant overlooking Kusadasi Harbour. (B, D)

Day 6: Kusadasi-Hierapolis-Pamukkale-Marmaris

After breakfast drive through the meandering plains and cotton farms, before arriving in Pamukkale. Once here enjoy the beauty of lime cascades and visit ancient Hierapolis - which has the biggest Necropolis (with 1200 gravestones) in Turkey. The Sacred Pool is also one of the highlights of the site. There shallow thermal waters ripple over a wonderful scattering of ancient Roman ruins that lie beneath. Afterwards return to your hotel to relax in the hot spring pool. Continue on to Marmaris for overnight at the Orsmaris Boutique. Dinner at the hotel's restaurant included. (B, D)

Day 7: Marmaris-Koycegiz-Fethiye

In the morning drive to the beautiful lakeside town of Koycegiz. On arrival board a boat cruise to the beautiful Turtle Beach (Iztuzu Beach) and smoother yourself in the rejuvenating mud of the mudbaths. Afterwards transfer back to the Marina Boutique

Day 9: Fethiye-Saklikent Gorge-Antalya

Early departure for Konya. On the way stop at the Aspendos Ancient Theatre. On arrival in Konya tour the monastery of the Mevlana Whirling Dervishes. In the afternoon drive to Cappadocia via Seljuk - a fine example of an ancient Silk Road Inn. Overnight and dinner in Cappadocia at the Gamirasu Cave Hotel. Gamirasu is an exquisitely restored small troglodyte cave house. The hotel is located in a restored thousand-year-old Byzantine monastic retreat which offers modern conveniences like swimming pool and restaurant without distracting from the spiritual feeling of the area which has been known to be inhabited for more than 5000 years. Gamirasu has been featured on Channel 9's Getaway Program. (B, D)

Day 11: Cappadocia

After breakfast enjoy a full day exploring Cappadocia including visits to the Kaymakli Underground City, the place early Christians hid from persecutors, Open Air Museum in Goreme to see the best examples of Byzantine art in Cappadocia in rock-cut churches with frescoes and paintings (10th to 13th century) and natural fortress in Uchisar. Tonight have dinner at a unique cave restaurant. Overnight stay in Cappadocia. (B, D)

Day 12: Cappadocia-Ankara-Safranbolu

Very early morning optional hot air balloon tour. After breakfast depart for Safranbolu. On the way stop by Ankara to visit the Mausoleum of Ataturk and the Museum in Ankara. This is the burial place of the national hero who founded modern Republic of Turkey. Afterwards continue to Safranbolu, the UNESCO World Heritage Town considered to be an open air museum. Day 13: Safranbolu-Istanbul

After breakfast visit the old town of Safranbolu where you can test the fine sample of Turkish delights then continue to drive to Istanbul to check in at the Arena Hotel. Afternoon at leisure, our local guide will recommend unique places to visit or shopping options. (B)

Day 1: Istanbul

Upon arrival meet and greet at the airport, escort you to the vehicle for transfer to your hotel for overnight stay. Overnight at Levni Istanbul Hotel.

Day 2: Istanbul

Tour Topkapi Palace (excluding Harem section), which served as the palace of the Ottoman Sultans between the 16th and 19th centuries. It has a superb position overlooking the Bosphorus. We also pay a visit to the Then to the magnificent Haghia Sophia (St Sophia's Basilica-closed on Mondays) built by Constantine the Great and reconstructed by Justinian in the 6th century. Then visit underground cistern basilica or Nakkas cistern (which is suitable for the program). Then we will finish the day with a visit to Grand Bazaar (closed on Sundays) which is the world's biggest and the oldest shopping venue. Overnight in Istanbul. (B, L)

Day 3: Istanbul-Canakkale

Morning pick up from your hotel and drive to Gallipoli and visit Anzac Cove, Lone Pine Cemetery, The Nek, 57th Regiment, chunuk bair later cross the Dardanelles, for dinner and overnight at Kolin Hotel. (B, L, D)

Early Morning optional Hot Air Balloon Tour. 

Day 1 Sat: Istanbul

On arrival transfer from Istanbul airport to hotel. Tonight you have a welcome meeting. Overnight at Double Tree By Hilton Piyalepaşa or similar.

The central Anatolian Plateau has a continental climate with hot summers and colder winters than those along the shore. Ankara has an average January temperature of 0° C and an average July temperature of 23° C. The eastern highlands experience even longer and colder winters.

Getting Around

Organised tours are the best way to explore Turkey as they allow access to the main must see sights. Public transport such as local trains and buses do not take you right to the door steps of the attractions but only to the closest main town. If you don't wish to take a coach tour, car rental and self-drive packages can be organised, however be mindful that driving in Turkey involves long distances, that there is traffic congestion in major cities and the universal urban challenge of finding a parking spot is always there.

Shopping

Turkey's bustling bazaars, markets, shops and stalls make this country an ideal shopping destination. Istanbul's Grand Bazaar hosts over 4000 stores where you need to be prepared to bargain, as this is an important part of your shopping trip and can give you that bargain you are looking for. This is the reason why many flock to Turkey

specifically for the shopping. Best buys include leather goods, textiles, stunning jewellery and local delicacies such as Turkish Delight. In rural areas, markets are colourful and vibrant, and is the best place to come across unique products and handmade items, such as rugs and angora bedspreads. Other crafts made of suede, copper, bronze, or ceramics, are also unique in nature including the famous Meerschaum Pipes.

Getting There

By Air: Emirates, Etihad, Singapore fly daily from Australia. Several other airlines have connections via European cities.

By Sea from Greece: Daily from April to October from Greece: from Samos Island to Kusadasi, from Kos Island to Bodrum and from Rhodes Island to Marmaris. There is no ferry from Athens to Istanbul or vice-versa.

Accommodation

The Suleymaniye Mosque, built by Suleyman the Magnificent and covered in fine white marble and stained glass windows. The Grand Bazaar which is a maze of over 4000 shops. A stay in Istanbul is not complete without a traditional boat trip along the Bosphorus.

Gallipoli: Visit the Gallipoli Peninsula, the scene of one of the bloodiest campaigns of World War I in which the Anzacs laid down their lives. Visit the

many sights around this area including ANZAC Cove, Lone Pine Cemetery, Johnston's Jolly (trenches and tunnels), The Nek and Chunuk Bair New Zealand Memorial. Perhaps take a morning tour of the archaeological sight of Troy, home to the Trojan Horse and the legendary story of Achilles as told by Homer. Seven Churches of the Apocalypse: Mentioned by St. John in the Book of Revelations, these seven churches are all found in Turkey including Efes (Ephesus), Izmir (Smyrna), Bergama (Pergamum), Akhisar (Thyatira), Sart (Sardis), Alasehir (Philadelpia) and Eskihsar (Laodicea).

Kusadasi: See the ancient site of Ephesus, one of Ancient Rome's greatest cities in the Western world along with its famous Library of Celsus and the House of Virgin Mary. See the city where the Gospel of John is rumoured to have been written. It is also the location where the enormous temple of Artemis, once considered a Wonder of the Ancient World, stood.

Pamukkale: The spectacular hot springs in Pamukkale, also known as the White Castle due to the lime deposits are a must visit. Discover the ruins of the spa city of Hierapolis built on top of the white castle.

Cappadocia: Explore the magical landscape of Cappadocia, with its fairy chimneys and its underground cities. Enjoy a awe-inspiring balloon ride over the remarkable landscape.

Confirmed bookings will be issued with an invoice upon confirmation detailing all services booked. It is your responsibility to ensure all details are correct. The right is reserved to correct any errors in rates quoted or calculated for any service notwithstanding that the invoice may have been paid in full.

SERVICES

The services we provide to you are limited to (a) the arrangement and coordination of your travel arrangements; and (b) the delivery of travel arrangements which we directly control. PRICES & EXCLUSIONS

We will not be responsible for any other loss or loss you incur in connection with your booking (for example, airfares and visa expenses) if you are prevented from commencing or continuing your trip in these circumstances.

CANCELLATIONS OR RESCHEDULING BY US

In these Booking Conditions, the term Force Majeure means an event or events beyond our control and which we could not have reasonably prevented, and includes but is not limited to: (a) natural disasters (including not limited to flooding, fire, earthquake, landslide, volcanic eruption), adverse weather conditions (including hurricane or cyclone), high or low water levels; (b) war, armed conflict, industrial dispute, civil strife, terrorist activity or the threat of such acts; epidemic, pandemic; (d) any new or change in law, order, decree, rule or regulation of any government authority (including travel advisories and restrictions).

Force Majeure – Prior to travel

If in our reasonable opinion we (either directly or through our employees, contractors, suppliers or agents) consider that your travel arrangements cannot safely or lawfully proceed due to a Force Majeure Event then we at our discretion may elect to:

- reschedule your travel arrangements (in whole or in part); and/or
- cancel your travel arrangements (in whole or in part), in which case our contract with you will terminate (in whole or in part).

If we cancel any of your travel arrangements, neither of us will have any claim for damages against the other for the cancelled arrangements.
